3 free jabs give you protection  
against hepatitis B

If you inject drugs – or if you live with an injector  
– you should be vaccinated against hepatitis B.

Even if you never share needles, syringes, spoons, water or filters,  
you could still be at risk from getting accidentally pricked by  
a needle or by having unsafe sex.

Protecting yourself from hepatitis B won't protect you from HIV and hepatitis C.  
You can catch these by sharing injecting equipment, needle-stick injuries and unsafe sex.  
But hepatitis B can be one less thing to worry about.
